- How does the reality of Paul's struggle in the Christian life encourage you in your own struggles?
- Why is it liberating to be honest about your wretchedness, and certain about forgiveness? What happens if we forget one or the other truth?
- How has Romans 1-7 changed your love for Jesus? Your desire to serve him? Your view of yourself?



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STRUGGLES WITH SIN Romans 7:7-25 JULY 10th , 2016

TWO TRUTHS OF THE GOSPEL IN ROMANS:

GOD IS HOLY, SO OUR SINS REQUIRE THAT WE BE PUNISHED:

You are more <u>sinful</u> than you could ever believe.

GOD IS GRACIOUS, SO IN CHRIST OUR SINS ARE DEALT WITH:

You are more <u>accepted</u> in Christ than you could ever imagine.

Romans 7:7-12

⁷ What then shall we say? That the law is sin? By no means! Yet if it had not been for the law, I would not have known sin. For I would not have known what it is to covet if the law had not said, "You shall not covet."⁸ But sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, produced in me all kinds of covetousness. For apart from the law, sin lies dead. ⁹ I was once alive apart from the law, but when the commandment came, sin came alive and I died. ¹⁰ The very commandment that promised life proved to be death to me. ¹¹ For sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, deceived me and through it killed me. ¹² So the law is holy, and the commandment is holy and righteous and good

What was the purpose of the Law?

- 1. The Law <u>Exposes</u> our Sin
- 2. The Law <u>Silences</u> our Excuses

Romans 7:13-14 ¹³ Did that which is good, then, bring death to me? By no means! It was sin, producing death in me through what is good, in order that sin might be shown to be sin, and through the commandment might become sinful beyond measure. ¹⁴ For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am of the flesh, sold under sin.

THE CHRISTIAN PROBLEM:

NO ONE GETS SO ADVANCED IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

THAT THEY NO LONGER STRUGGLE WITH SIN

THREE STRUGGLES OF THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

Romans 7:15-17¹⁵ For I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. ¹⁶ Now if I do what I do not want, I agree with the law, that it is good. ¹⁷ So now it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me.

1. THE STRUGGLE TO LIVE UP TO WHAT WE KNOW WE OUGHT TO BE

> I am not yet who I ought to be but I am also not who I used to be

Romans 7:18-20¹⁸ For I know that nothing good dwells in me, that is, in my flesh. For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out. ¹⁹ For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing. ²⁰ Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me.

2. THE STRUGGLE WITH REPEATED FAILURE

> My failures remind me of the places where Jesus is still at work

Romans 7:21-23²¹ So I find it to be a law that when I want to do right, evil lies close at hand. ²² For I delight in the law of God, in my inner being, ²³ but I see in my members another law waging war against the law of my mind and making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members.

3. THE STRUGGLE TO ADMIT THE <u>WAR</u> WITHIN US

> My battle against sin is a <u>testimony</u> that Jesus has already won!

TWO CRIES OF THE CHRISTIAN HEART

Romans 7:24-25²⁴ Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death? ²⁵ Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, I myself serve the law of God with my mind, but with my flesh I serve the law of sin.

- > Cry of <u>Discouragement</u>: Who will rescue me?
- > Cry of <u>Hope</u>: Christ has rescued and will rescue me!
